1. INTRODUCTION

At the previous AGM of the Company held on 15 June 2021, Jishan Group had obtained a mandate to enter into RRPT with the Related Parties in the ordinary course of business based on commercial terms which are not more favourable to the Related Parties than those generally available to the public which are necessary for the Group's day-to-day operations ("**Last Mandate**").

The said mandate for RRPT(s) shall lapse at the conclusion of the forthcoming AGM unless authority for its renewal is obtained from the shareholders of Jishan at the forthcoming AGM. Hence, the Company intends to seek its shareholders' approval at the forthcoming AGM for the renewal of the said mandate for the existing RRPT(s) and further seek a new shareholders' mandate for additional RRPT.

The purpose of this Circular is to provide the shareholders with the relevant information on the Proposed Mandates and to seek your approval for the ordinary resolution pertaining to the Proposed Mandates to be tabled at the forthcoming AGM.

YOU ARE ADVISED TO READ AND CAREFULLY CONSIDER THE CONTENTS OF THIS CIRCULAR TOGETHER WITH THE APPENDIX CONTAINED HEREIN BEFORE VOTING ON THE ORDINARY RESOLUTION PERTAINING TO THE PROPOSED MANDATES.

2. INFORMATION ON THE PROPOSED MANDATES

2.1 Principal Activities of Jishan Group

Jishan is principally an investment holding company whilst the principal activities of its subsidiaries are as follows:

- (1) Ng Eng Siong is our Managing Director and controlling shareholder by virtue of his shareholding in Jishan Capital. Khor Keow Kuang is our Executive Director and controlling shareholder by virtue of her shareholding in Jishan Capital, whilst Jishan Capital is our controlling shareholder.
- (2) Khor Keow Kuang is our Executive Director and controlling shareholder by virtue of her shareholding in Jishan Capital. Khor Keow Kuang is the controlling shareholder and director of NMSB.
- (3) Khor Chew Wan is our Substantial Shareholder. Ng Eng Siong is our Managing Director and controlling shareholder by virtue of his shareholding in Jishan Capital. Khor Keow Kuang is our Executive Director and controlling shareholder by virtue of her shareholding in Jishan Capital. Ng Swee Long is the spouse of Khor Chew Wan, and brother-in-law to Khor Keow Kuang and Ng Eng Siong.

Notes to Section 2.2(a) and 2.2(b) (cont'd):

- (4) *The tenancy agreement between JSP Plas and Jishan Capital for the rental of 2 adjoining 1½-storey terrace light industrial building had expired on 31 August 2021. JSP Plas did not renew the said tenancy agreement with Jishan Capital.*

Subsequently, a tenancy agreement was executed between JP Hub and Jishan Capital on 8 September 2021 for the rental of 2 adjoining 1½-storey terrace light industrial building. The period of tenancy shall be 2 years from the commencement date of 1 October 2021.

- (5) *The estimated values of the RRPT(s) are based on information available at the point of estimation and taking into account the management's forecasts on transaction values which have been undertaken and anticipated. Disclosure will be made in the next annual audited financial statements ("AFS") of the Group on the actual value of transactions conducted during the FYE 2022 and where applicable, in the next circular to shareholders seeking renewal of the Proposed Mandates.*

The transactions are necessary for Jishan Group's day-to-day operations and are in the ordinary course of business and are on terms not more favourable to the Related Parties than those generally available to the public and are not to the detrimental of the minority shareholders of the Company.

- (6) *As defined under Section 2.6 of this Circular.*

- c) Amount Due and Owing to Jishan Group pursuant to RRPT(s)

As at 31 December 2021, there is no amount due and owing to Jishan Group by the Related Parties (in this context, Jishan Capital, NMSB and Ng Swee Long) pursuant to the RRPT(s).

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2.3 Review Procedures for RRPT(s)

Our Group adheres to the following procedures and guidelines to ensure that RRPT(s) is undertaken on commercial terms that are not more favourable to the Related Parties than those generally available to the public and not to the detriment of the minority shareholders; and the transaction price is determined on arm's length basis:

- (a) Our Board and employees within the Group are notified that any RRPT(s) is required to be undertaken on an arm's length basis under normal commercial terms consistent with the Group's business practices and policies, and on terms not more favourable to the Related Parties than those generally available to the public and is not to the detriment of the minority shareholders;
- (b) Records shall be maintained by the Company to capture all RRPT(s) which are entered into pursuant to the Proposed Mandates;
- (c) All RRPT(s) entered into shall be reviewed by the non-interested Director(s) to ascertain that the procedures and guidelines established to monitor the RRPT(s) have been complied with;
- (d) All RRPT(s) shall be carried out on an arm's length basis and based on the Group's normal commercial terms which are not more favourable to the Related Parties than those generally available to the public and are not detrimental to the minority shareholders;
- (e) If a member of the Board has an interest in the RRPT(s), he/she shall abstain from any decision-making by the Board in respect of such transaction(s) and continue to abstain from voting on the resolution approving the transaction(s); and
- (f) At least 2 other contemporaneous transactions with / quotations from unrelated third parties for similar products, services and/or quantities will be used as comparison, wherever possible, to determine whether the price and terms offered by/to the Related Parties are fair and reasonable and comparable to those offered by/to other unrelated third parties for the same or substantially similar type of products, services and/or quantities.

In the event that quotation or comparative pricing from unrelated third parties cannot be obtained for the proposed transaction(s), the transaction price shall be determined based on the Group's usual business policies and practices to ensure that the RRPT(s) are not detrimental to the Group.

2.4 Threshold for Authority

There is no specific threshold for approval of the RRPT(s) within the Group. However, all RRPT(s) shall be reviewed and authorised by an Executive Director of the Company, provided always that such personnel has no interest (direct or indirect) in the RRPT(s) and where necessary and applicable, the RRPT(s) has been approved pursuant to the shareholders' approval of the RRPT(s) in the general meetings.

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2.5 Disclosure in Annual Audited Consolidated Financial Statements

Disclosure will be made in the next AFS of the Group on the actual value of transactions conducted during the FYE 2022 and where applicable, in the next circular to shareholders seeking renewal of the Proposed Mandates.

2.6 Validity Period for the Proposed Mandates

If approved at the forthcoming AGM, the Proposed Mandates is subject to annual review. In this respect, any authority conferred by the Proposed Mandates shall only continue to be in force until:

- (a) the conclusion of the next AGM of the Company following the general meeting at which such mandate was passed, at which time it will lapse, unless by a resolution passed at the meeting, the authority is renewed;
- (b) the expiration of the period within which the next AGM of the Company after that date is required by law to be held pursuant to Section 340(2) of the Companies Act, 2016 (“**Act**”) (but shall not extend to such extension as may be allowed by law pursuant to Section 340(4) of the Act); or
- (c) revoked or varied by resolution passed by the shareholders in a general meeting;

whichever is the earlier.

Thereafter, if the Board (save for the interested Director(s)) decides that the renewal of the Proposed Mandates is desirable, shareholders’ approval for such renewal will be sought at each subsequent AGM of the Company.

3. RATIONALE AND BENEFITS FOR THE PROPOSED MANDATES

3.1 Rationale

- (a) The RRPT(s) envisaged under the Proposed Mandates are in the ordinary course of business of the Jishan Group undertaken on an arm’s length basis, based on normal commercial terms which are not more favourable to the Related Parties than those generally available to the public and not detrimental to the interests of the minority shareholders. They are recurring transactions of revenue or trading nature which are likely to occur with some degree of frequency and could arise at any time and from time to time. These transactions may be constrained by the time-sensitive nature of such transactions and it may be impractical to seek shareholders’ approval on a case-to-case basis before entering into such RRPT(s);
- (b) The Proposed Mandates will eliminate the need to make regular announcements to Bursa Securities and to convene separate general meeting from time to time to seek shareholders’ approval as and when the need arises, thus enabling the Group to transact with the Related Parties in an expeditious manner to meet business needs that are necessary for its day-to-day operations; and
- (c) The Proposed Mandates will also reduce substantial administrative time, inconvenience and expenses associated with the convening of a separate meeting for approval of each transaction, without compromising the corporate objectives of the Group and adversely affecting the business opportunities available to, or operational matters in respect of, the Group.

3.2 Benefits

For the purchasing of solar energy by Jishan Pack from the Related Party (the details as disclosed under Item 2 of Section 2.2(a) of this Circular), it is beneficial to our Group as the normal electricity rate imposed by Tenaga Nasional Berhad is RM0.441 per kilowatt-hour ("kWh") and RM0.355 per kWh for Plant 1 and Plant 2, respectively, whilst the agreed solar energy rate payable to the Related Party is RM0.415 per kWh and RM.303 per kWh for Plant 1 and Plant 2, respectively. This represents a saving of approximately 5.90% and 14.65% for Plant 1 and Plant 2, respectively.

For the purchasing of die cut moulding materials by Jishan Pack from the Related Party (the details as disclosed under Item 3 of Section 2.2(a) of this Circular), it is beneficial to our Group in terms of expeditious response time and hassle-free delivery of materials, due to the close proximity of NMSB's operations to our manufacturing facility.

For the renting of premises by Jishan Pack from the Related Party (the details as disclosed under Item 4 of Section 2.2(a) of this Circular), it is beneficial to our Group as the premises rented is within close proximity to Plant 1, Plant 2 and Plant 3 respectively.

For the renting of 2 adjoining 1½-storey terrace light industrial building by JP Hub from the Related Party (the details as disclosed under Item 1 of Section 2.2(b) of this Circular), it is beneficial to our Group for ease of management and supervision as the properties rented are located within close proximity to Plant 1. Furthermore, the Group also enjoys the renting of the properties at a competitive rate compared to the prevailing market rental rate in the surrounding area.

4. EFFECTS OF THE PROPOSED MANDATES

The Proposed Mandates will neither have any effect on the share capital and substantial shareholders' shareholdings of the Company, nor any significant effect on the earnings, net assets and gearing of the Group.

WYNCORP, being the Continuing Advisor to the Company has given and has not subsequently withdrawn its written consent to the inclusion in this Circular of its name and all references thereto in the form and context in which they appear in this Circular.

WYNCORP's role is to advise the Company on the disclosure requirements pertaining to the RRPT(s).

WYNCORP is not aware of any conflict of interest which exists or is likely to exist in its capacity as the Continuing Advisor to the Company for the Proposed Mandates.

3. LITIGATION, CLAIMS OR ARBITRATION

Save as disclosed below, as at the LPD, neither the Company nor any of its subsidiaries are engaged in any litigation, claims or arbitration, either as plaintiff or defendant, which has a material effect on the business or financial position of the Company and/or its subsidiaries and the Board has no knowledge of any proceeding pending or threatened against the Company and/or its subsidiaries or of any fact likely to give rise to any proceeding which might materially and adversely affect the business or financial position of the Company and/or its subsidiaries.

High Court of Kuala Lumpur (Civil suit no. WA-22IP-12-03/2022) brought by Yang Chang Kwong and Wang Chih-Shun (collectively known as "Plaintiffs") against Jishan Packaging Hub Sdn. Bhd. ("Defendant")

As at the LPD, Jishan Packaging Hub Sdn. Bhd., a wholly owned subsidiary of the Company was engaged in an on-going litigation as a Defendant. The details on the on-going litigation are as follows:

The Plaintiffs has commenced the above legal proceedings against the Defendant wherein it is alleged, *inter alia*, that the Defendant was being accused of storing, offering and making available for sale egg tray which infringed the design features and configurations owned by the Plaintiffs that have been registered with the Intellectual Property Corporation of Malaysia (as set out within Malaysian Industrial Design Registration No. 18-00995-0101) ("**Plaintiff's Industrial Design**").

The Writ of Summons and Statement of Claim, both dated 31 March 2022, were served on the Defendant on 4 April 2022. The Defendant, through its solicitors, has filed its Memorandum of Appearance and the Statement of Defence with the Kuala Lumpur High Court on 12 April 2022 and 27 April 2022, respectively.

The Plaintiffs are claiming against Defendant and seeking for the following orders/reliefs:

- a) A declaration that the Defendant (either acting in person or through its officers or agents) is storing, offering and making available for sale egg tray which infringed the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design ("**Infringing Articles**") and/or fraudulently imitating the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design and/or obviously imitating the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design in Malaysia without the permission of the Plaintiffs; which violates the rights of the Plaintiffs under the Industrial Designs Act 1996;b) An injunction prohibiting the Defendant, either by itself or through its officers, employees, agents, personnel, distributors, and/or its affiliates or anyone of them either collectively or individually from:

- (i) infringing the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design ;
 - (ii) directly or indirectly using egg tray with the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design or fraudulently imitating the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design or obviously imitating the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design;
 - (iii) importing the Infringing Articles and/or egg tray bearing the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design or fraudulently imitating or obviously imitating the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design into Malaysia to sell, or for trade or business purpose; which the Defendant is having direct or indirect knowledge of violations with the relevant foreign laws and regulations;
 - (iv) directly or indirectly producing, manufacturing, distributing for trade or business purpose, selling, leasing, offering or making available for sale, supplying or use for any purpose of trade or business, ordering or storing for sale or lease or offer or storage for leasing; the Infringing Articles and/or any egg tray bearing the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design or fraudulently imitating the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design or obviously imitating the Plaintiffs' Design;
- c) A Court order for the Defendant:
- (i) to submit to the Plaintiffs or the Plaintiff's solicitors or representatives, all the Infringement Articles and/or any egg tray bearing the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design or fraudulently imitating or obviously imitating the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design within the possession, authority, custody or control of the Defendant, either by himself, or through its officers, employees, agents, personnel, distributors, and/or affiliates;
 - (ii) to submit to the Plaintiffs or the Plaintiff's solicitors or representatives, all information, materials, moulds, articles, goods and documents relating to the production, manufacturing, distribution for the purpose of trade, business, leasing, offering or making available for sale, supplying, ordering or storing for sale or leasing or offering or storage for leasing the Infringement Articles and/or any egg tray bearing the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design or fraudulently imitating or obviously imitating the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design;
 - (iii) to pledge, file in the Court and deliver to the Plaintiffs' solicitors an affidavit pledging to comply with the terms set out under paragraphs (iii)(a) and paragraph (iii)(b) within fourteen (14) days from the date of the Court order;
- d) An assessment on compensation for damages or at the Plaintiffs' option, profit made by the Defendant arising from the infringement of the Plaintiffs' Industrial Design; and an order for all the sums as determined by the assessment to be paid to the Plaintiffs;
- e) Interest on the amount ordered to be paid by the Defendant to the Plaintiffs;
- f) Legal costs; and
- g) Any other or further reliefs as the Honourable Court thinks is fair or proper in the circumstances.

At this juncture, no judgement has been made by the Court on the Writ of Summons and Statement of Claim. The Group is denying any infringement and is seeking to defend against the allegations. The Group is at the stage of refining the prototype of egg tray and has yet to commercialise the sale of egg tray. The prototype was produced based on the Group's internal designs and specifications, for which the Group has submitted an application to Intellectual Property Corporation of Malaysia (MyIPO) for registration of the industrial design.

The Board is of the opinion that the Group will succeed in its defence against the allegations. Barring any unforeseen circumstances, in the event the court judgement is unfavourable against the Group, the Board does not anticipate the compensation/claim amount would result in any material impact to the Group's financial performance and position. In this context, the Board does not anticipate the amount to be in excess of RM200,000 being the amount originally sought by the Plaintiffs prior to the filing of Writ of Summons and Statement of Claim
